

November 2015 Paris attacks

The **November 2015 Paris attacks** were a series of coordinated <u>terrorist attacks</u> that took place on 13 November 2015 in Paris, France and the city's northern suburb, <u>Saint-Denis</u>. Beginning at 21:16 <u>CET</u>, three <u>suicide bombers</u> struck outside the <u>Stade de France</u> in Saint-Denis, during a football match. This was followed by several mass shootings and a suicide bombing, at cafés and restaurants. Gunmen carried out another mass shooting and took hostages at an <u>Eagles of Death Metal</u> concert in the <u>Bataclan theatre</u>, leading to a stand-off with police. The attackers were shot or blew themselves up when police raided the theatre. [13]

The attackers killed 130 people, including 90 at the Bataclan theatre. [14][15][16] Another 413[5] people were injured, including 100 seriously. [6][7] Seven of the attackers also died while the authorities continued to search for accomplices. [4] The attacks were the deadliest in France since the Second World War, [18][19] and the second deadliest in the European Union since the Madrid train bombings in 2004. [20] France had been on high alert since the January 2015 attacks on Charlie Hebdo offices and a Jewish supermarket in Paris that killed 17 people and wounded 22, including civilians and police officers. [21]

The <u>Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant</u> (ISIL) claimed responsibility for the attacks, [8][9] saying that it was retaliation for the French <u>airstrikes on ISIL targets</u> in <u>Syria</u> and Iraq. [10][11] The President of France, <u>François Hollande</u>, said the attacks were an <u>act of war</u> by ISIL. [22][23][24] The attacks were planned in Syria and organised by <u>a terrorist cell based in Belgium</u>. [25] Most of the Paris attackers had French or Belgian citizenship, two were Iraqis, [26][27] and some had <u>fought in Syria</u>. [28] Some of them had entered Europe among <u>the flow of migrants and refugees</u>. [29][30]

In response to the attacks, a three-month <u>state of emergency</u> was declared across the country to help fight terrorism, which involved the banning of public demonstrations, and allowing the police to carry out searches without a warrant, put anyone under house arrest without trial and block websites that encouraged acts of terrorism. On 15 November, France launched the biggest airstrike of <u>Opération Chammal</u>, its contribution to the anti-ISIL bombing campaign, striking ISIL targets in <u>Raqqa</u>. On 18 November, the suspected lead operative of the attacks, <u>Abdelhamid Abaaoud</u>, was killed in <u>a police raid in Saint-Denis</u>, along with two others.
